What is a Hate Crime?

A hate crime is when someone says something mean or hurts you because of your r<u>eligion</u>, d<u>isability</u> or r<u>ace</u>.





- She had 3 daughters, 6 grandchildren, and 11 greatgrandchildren.
- She was 101 years old when she died.
