What is a Hate Crime?

A hate crime is when someone says something mean or hurts you because of your religion, disability or race.



Words you might need to know today

- Discrimination**→ Unfairly treating someone badly because of things they can't change.
- Racism**→ Unfairly treating someone badly because of their race or ethnicity.
- Gender**→ Someone's identity as (usually) male or female; they could be both or neither.
- Prejudice**→ An opinion that is not based in known facts about someone or actual experience.
- Perceived**→ Interpreting something a certain way, maybe because of things they think instead of know.
- Ethnicity**→ Belonging to a group of people who share a common culture or background.

- She was in a choir.
- She had 3 daughters, 6 grandchildren, and 11 great-grandchildren.
- She was 101 years old when she died.
