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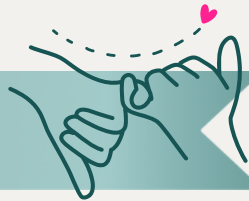

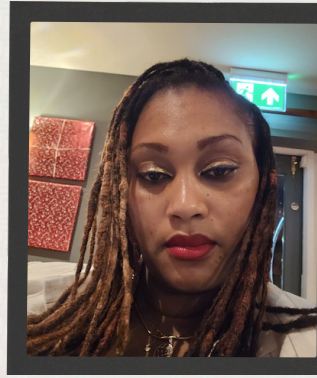

A message from the chair



This year has been one of reflection, resilience and renewal for Dundee International Women's Centre.

We began by strengthening our governance and ways of working. Members approved an update to our Articles of Association in January 2025 to allow our Board to meet online, ensuring we remain accessible and effective. Trustees also took part in development sessions and continued to focus on the long-term sustainability of the centre.

Our values were reviewed and new values created which are Trust, Respect, Support, Equality, and Approachability which were refreshed through consultation with staff, volunteers, and members. These values now guide every decision we make and shape how we work with our community.

We continue to support women from minority ethnic and disadvantaged backgrounds to learn, connect and build confidence. From accredited qualifications and digital skills to wellbeing sessions, cultural events and childcare through our Rise and Shine Crèche, the centre remains a lifeline for many.

Our projects this year including Connecting Cultures, Respected, Equal and Safe and Stobswell West have tackled inequality, promoted community cohesion and supported women to overcome isolation, poverty, and barriers to opportunity.

We are proud of the recognition received this year, including the Welcoming Women Award and being finalists in the Dundee Social Enterprise Awards.

I want to thank our staff, volunteers, funders, and partners for their commitment and belief in what we do. Together, we are making a lasting difference in the lives of women and families across Dundee.

A message from the manager

The past year has been both challenging and inspiring. Demand for our services continues to grow as more women face complex issues linked to poverty, isolation and migration.

Despite this, our team has achieved outstanding results through creativity, collaboration and a shared commitment to our values.

We introduced new learning opportunities, including Beauty for Beginners, Driving Theory, ICDL Digital Skills, Welcome to Scotland and Toddler Plus One. Ten women completed our new SQA Working with Numbers qualification, while 25 others-built confidence in numeracy - an achievement made possible through Dundee City Council's UK Shared Prosperity funding.

Through our Connecting Cultures project, we delivered cultural awareness and anti-hate crime training across Scotland and supported parents and professionals to recognise online risks. The Respected, Equal and Safe project continued vital work addressing violence against women and girls, particularly within BME communities.

The Stobswell West initiative brought services together in one of Dundee's most deprived areas, helping families access support, improve employability, and build community connections.

We invested in staff development through Insights Discovery, safeguarding training, and leadership development. Thanks to ROSA funding, we created a new Team Leader post - strengthening internal capacity and progression with a new team leader starting with us later this year which we are all excited about.

Our Rise and Shine Crèche continues to grow as a social enterprise, providing high-quality childcare and supporting women's participation in learning.

While financial pressures and funding uncertainty remain significant challenges, our team's commitment and adaptability keep the organisation strong. We are focused on sustainability through partnership working, social enterprise growth, and strategic funding applications.

DIWC continues to be a place where women gain confidence, education, and community.

Every class, event, and conversation builds towards our vision of equality and empowerment.

I also want to take this opportunity to thank our amazing team of staff, our dedicated and supportive volunteers, and every woman and child who uses our centre. We know there are tough challenges ahead, especially around funding, but the laughter and learning that fill the centre each day give us renewed determination to keep DIWC thriving as a safe, women-only space that continues to inspire and empower.

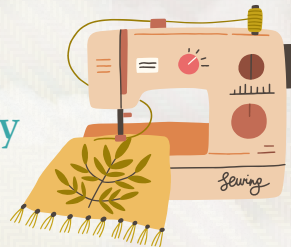

Respected, Equal and Safe

Empowering Women, Building Safety

Our Respected, Equal and Safe project supports women from Black and Minority Ethnic (BAME) communities to recognise and challenge gender inequality and violence against women. Through language learning, creative workshops, and one-to-one support, we help women find their voices and build safer, stronger lives.



44 women engaged in funded activities
32 participants joined 7 awareness workshops
12 women received one-to-one support for domestic abuse
6 new clients accessed help for the first time
27 professionals attended our IWD Learning Resources launch
1000+ resource downloads in the first two months

Our Impact

Inspiration & Confidence

Workshops celebrating #AccelerateAction for International Women's Day inspired women to pursue education, work, and activism. Participants described feeling "motivated to never give up" and to "teach our daughters to fight for equality."

Safety & Support

We responded to a rise in domestic abuse disclosures, offering immediate risk assessment, housing and benefits support, and emotional care in a safe, trusted environment.

Collaboration & Change

Monthly drop-ins with the Scottish Women's Rights Centre and creative sessions with Engender and ScrapAntics connected women with vital legal and wellbeing resources.

Connecting Cultures

A community-led project delivering workshops and partnerships across Scotland to promote diversity, inclusion, and resilience against hate and division.

Participants: **392**

Workshops & Events Delivered: **16**

Organisations Engaged: **12**

Communities Represented:

Scottish, Asian, Arab, African, Eastern

European, and Ukrainian

85% of participants reported greater confidence in engaging with other cultures.



Outcomes:

Diversity Understood & Valued:

- 3 workshops (**35 participants**) improved awareness of bias and inclusion, encouraging cultural understanding and connection.

Respectful & Inclusive Communities:

- 3 sessions and a multicultural flea market (**120 participants**) fostered dialogue, tolerance, and shared cultural experiences.



Stronger Community Connections:

- 3 sessions (**95 participants**) with police, universities, and healthcare professionals built confidence and trust across communities.



Resilience Against Division & Hate:

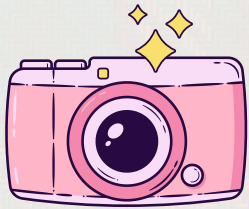
- 4 Rumours to Riots workshops (**142 participants**) tackled misinformation and hate, improving critical thinking and awareness. Resources adopted by prevention teams for national delivery.

Impact Highlights

- Individuals supported with immigration, housing, energy, and basic needs, including direct aid such as hygiene packs, food vouchers, and clothing.
- Multi-agency collaboration has enabled income maximisation, employability opportunities, and family support.
- Case studies show the value of trusted, one-to-one rapport, empowering people to take steps toward stability and opportunity.

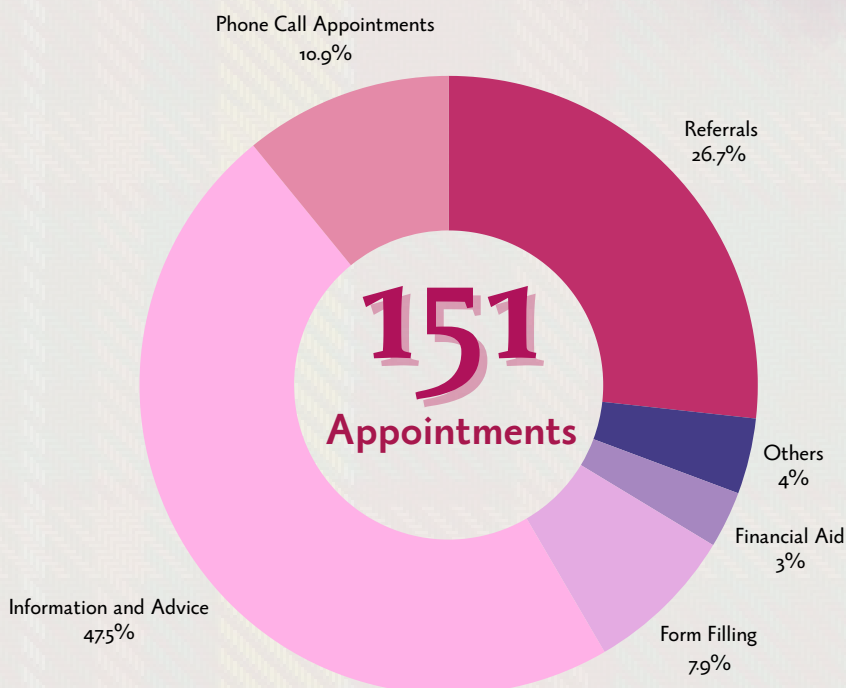

Shifted from drop-in model to referral-based support, enabling holistic assessments and tailored referrals.

85 individuals and families received one-to-one support

44 referrals made to partner organisations such as Citizens Advice, Dundee Women's Aid and DCC Housing.

Women Together Project

Since launching in October, our buddying program has provided vital support and opportunities for women to connect, learn, and grow at Dundee International Women's Centre (DIWC).

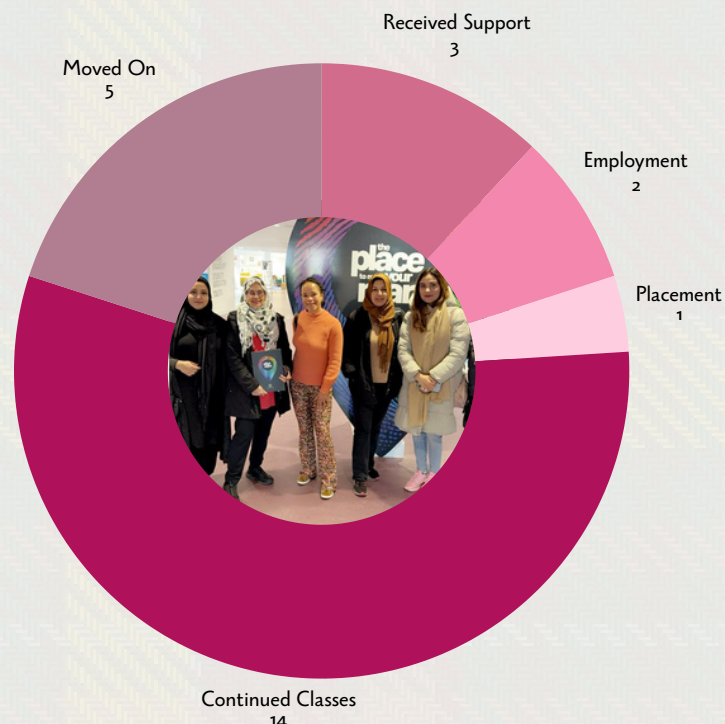

Member A - A single mother facing anxiety found confidence and joy through volunteering and teaching beauty classes. She is now exploring education and career opportunities in the beauty industry.

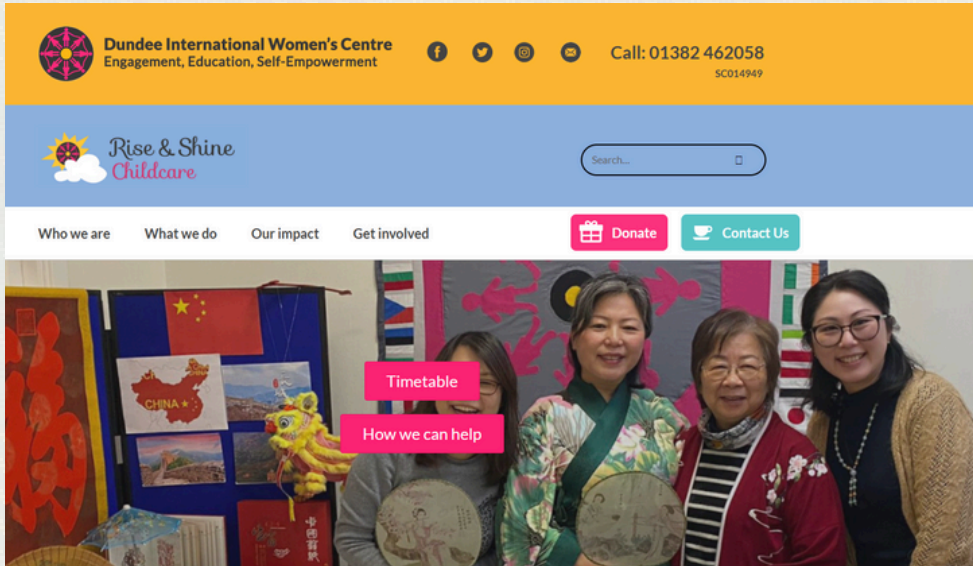
Member B - A single mother living with cancer rebuilt her confidence through drop-in services and community support. She now attends events regularly and feels safe and connected.

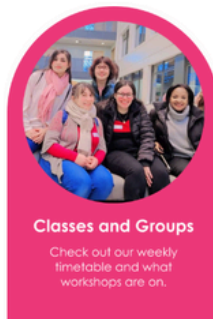

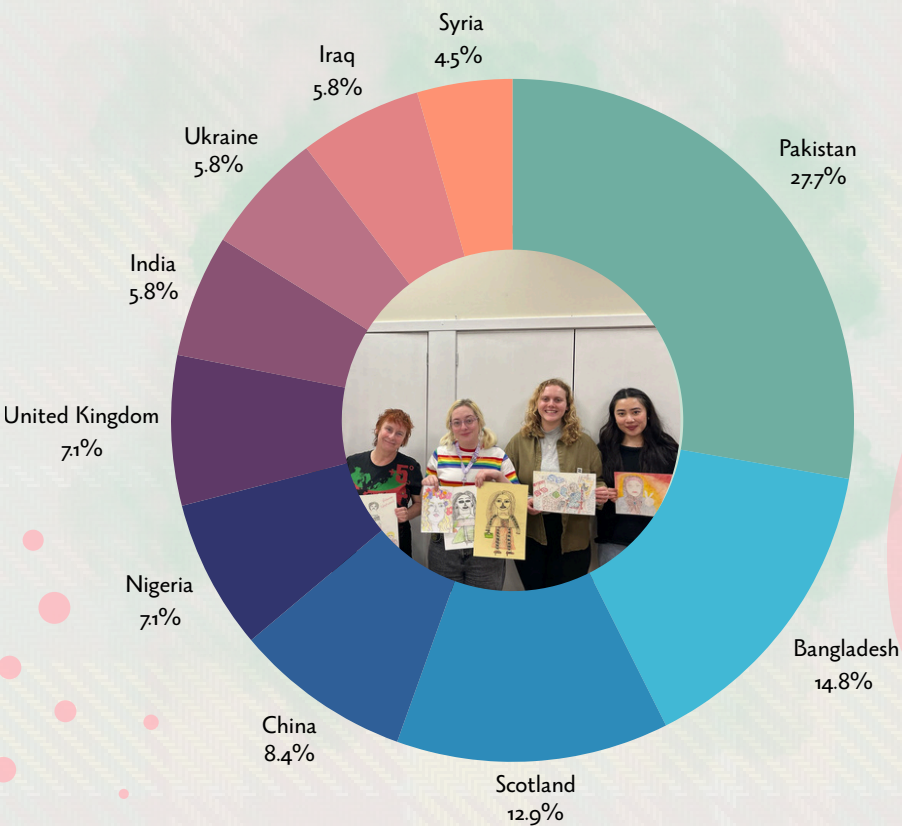

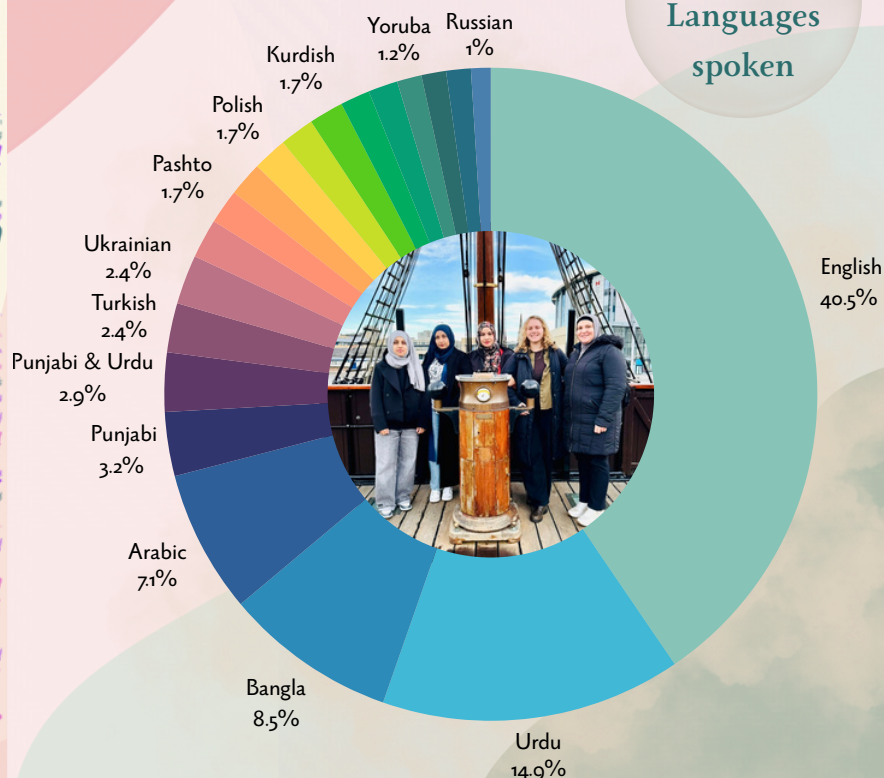
